



Student Assessment Result Comparisons


3RD GRADE STATE ASSESSMENTS

Kent Prairie Elementary opened in 1993 and houses 25 kindergarten through fifth-grade general education classrooms, resource room and remedial assistance room. Kent Prairie also houses the district program for K-5 students who need extended resource support. Other teaching areas include a computer lab, three instructional pods and music room. The Kent Prairie library, stage and gymnasium are teaching stations during the day and host a variety of community activities after school. The PTA has added playground equipment over the years to provide many areas for students to play at recess time. These outdoor areas are also used by the community when school is not in

School Improvement Plan

Kent Prairie Elementary learning community members work toward the improvement of academic achievement and social/emotional growth for all students. We continue using a continuous improvement model as we investigate different sources of data, set goals, and implement key strategies. Our staff members developed and trained in strategies related to students taking ownership of questioning and discussions as one strategy to maximize student engagement in learning. With mathematics, we worked to support problem solving and number sense skills as staff were trained in and students engaged in Number Talks in each classroom. In all subject areas, we emphasize technology as a

tool to engage 21st Century students, including the use of interactive Promethean boards, over 200 iPads, and both mobile and fixed computer labs. We continue to seek technology programs that provide opportunities for differentiated learning experiences. Finally, grade level PLC teams, in concert with special education and other support staff, commit a minimum of one hour per week to collaborate for improving student achievement, developing common assessments and finding/providing interventions for struggling students. These and other efforts lead to being recognized as a Washington Achievement Award school for the fourth year in a row.
